

Camp SHARP 2017

Gallaudet's Speech, Hearing, Aural Rehabilitation Program





The Gallaudet University Hearing and Speech Center (HSC) is once again hosting Camp SHARP. Camp SHARP is Gallaudet University's **S**peech, **H**earing, and **A**ural **R**ehabilitation **P**rogram for deaf and hard-of-hearing preschool children. This camp is designed for preschool children to develop their speech, language and listening skills in a fun, play-based preschool environment. Speech-language pathologists facilitate and support the development and expansion of the campers' speech and language skills while reinforcing sign language skills during child-centered, hands on activities within thematic units. Skill areas addressed include the following: speech, expressive and receptive language, speech-reading, listening, and early literacy skills.

This summer's services are offered between June 19 and July 28, 2017. The <u>registration</u> <u>deadline is May 27, 2017.</u> Services and session availability, as well as registration cut-off dates, are contingent upon the number of children enrolled.





Camp Features

Services provided by a team of graduate students in Speech-Language Pathology, led by certified, licensed Speech-Language Pathologists

Clinicians proficient in American Sign Language

Focus on speech, language, speechreading and listening skills within a literacy-rich environment

Serves children age 2.5 years to 5 years (*Exceptions will be considered on a case-by-case basis)

Theme-based, developmentally appropriate activities

Morning sessions (8:45-12:15)

Low child to clinician ratio

Full camp period: June 19 – July 28, 2017 (*excluding July 4, 2017)







Dates:

June 19 – July 28, 2017 (6 weeks) *We will not meet on July 4, 2017

Times:

8:45-12:15: Camp SHARP Program

- Drop-off by 8:45 am
- Program from 9:00 am-12:00 noon
- Pick-up by 12:15 pm

Ages:

Preschool children between ages 2.5-5

(*Exceptions will be considered on a case-by-case basis.)

Camper Requirements:

Campers should...

•Use/practice both spoken English and American Sign Language (or be willing to learn both during the Camp SHARP period).

--Spoken English does not need to be the dominant communication modality, but development of/exposure to this skill should be a goal for the child --ASL does not need to be the dominant communication modality, but sign language will be incorporated throughout each day to reinforce understanding/learning for those who need it.

- •Have a documented hearing loss (audiogram required for admission)
- **Use amplification (e.g., hearing aid, cochlear implant, BAHA, etc..; or a combination of these); (*recommended, but not required)
- •*Have participated in a preschool, earlyintervention and/or daycare environment prior to Camp SHARP (*recommended, but not required)

Fee:

\$1250.00 for the full 6 week program

- A nonrefundable deposit of \$500.00 will be due at the time of registration
- A weekly rate of \$250 is available. Campers are required to attend a minimum of 2 consecutive weeks of the Camp to register with the weekly rate. (\$500 deposit still applies)

Parent Information:

Informational and interactive sessions will be offered by GUHSC staff and/or HSLS Faculty once weekly, depending on parent interest and/or availability. Possible topics include:
Language Access – Choosing Modalities;
Understanding the Audiogram; Amplification – Management/Benefits; Behavior
Promotion/Management; Cochlear Implants, and Speech, Language, and Auditory
Development. Presenters are proficient in ASL and spoken English.

Gallaudet University is located at 800 Florida Avenue, NE Washington, DC 20002. Camp is held in the new Sorenson Language Communication Center (SLCC) pictured above.
